When benefits allow, Kaiser Permanente will reimburse medical services performed by a pharmacist in accordance with Washington State Law. The law states that the health plans must not deny any service performed by a pharmacist if the service is within the lawful scope of the license; the plan would have provided benefits if the service had been performed by a physician, advanced registered nurse practitioner, or a physician's assistant licensed under Washington State regulations, and the pharmacist is included in the plan's network of participating providers. Reimbursable services include Medication Therapy Management services (MTM), medication/vaccination services, diabetes self-management, potential harm reduction services, and some lab interpretation services.  The following Commercial plans are excluded  • Federal plans  • Commercial self-insured plans

## **Frequently Asked Questions**

- Q1: Will Kaiser Permanente reimburse services from a delegated pharmacist for a commercial member?
- A1: Yes. Kaiser Permanente follows Washington State legislation, Senate Bill 5557; which allows pharmacists with delegated agreements to bill the health plan for services in 2016. The senate bill will expand and allow for all other qualified pharmacists to bill for services in 2017.
- Q2: Will cost shares apply to the member for the service performed by the pharmacist?
- **A2:** Yes. The pharmacist service will be subject to member's appropriate cost share. Services performed by a pharmacist are considered a primary care service, unless performed by an oncology pharmacist and then the service would be subject a to a specialty care cost share if applicable.
- Q3: Will Kaiser Permanente reimburse CPT 99211 from a delegated pharmacist for a commercial member?
- **A3:** Yes. NCCI coding guidelines advise to use the most appropriate CPT code.
