\*Calculate using formula: Average number of patients seen in the office per hour divided by Average number of physicians in the office per hour to obtain minimum number of seats needed in waiting room: (i.e. 100 patients per hour/10 doctors per hour=minimum number of 10 seats in waiting room.

**Scoring the Site Review:** Each affirmatively answered question is worth 2 points. OEA threshold >=90% (total of 38 points). Records management threshold>=75% (total of 8 points). Scoring below threshold requires a written corrective action plan (CAP) within 30 days with a follow-up site visit every six months until the deficiencies are corrected.
